

Capo di Bove

Property of the State since 2002, the archeological importance of the area was already known, but it was only after the State's acquisition that excavations were started, leading to the discovery of a untouched thermal plant, whose first phase of construction is dated to the mid-second century AD.

The structure was probably private property for the use of a villa or a group of people belonging to a corporation or a collegium. The discovery of mosaics, fragments of polychrome marble and portions of painted plaster denotes a particularly elegant and refined atmosphere.

In this area of 8500 square meters the construction of a public access area is underway, with the main building to house the Appian Documentation Centre and the Archives of Antonio Cederna.
